Audrey was an amazing cook and enjoyed spending time with her family and friends over a cup of coffee or some good food. Sundays were spent visiting family in Rayne. While her brothers were known for their sense of humor, she encompassed this trait as well. She could be quick-witted and at times her humor came when the receiver didn't expect it, making it even more humorous. To know her was to love her.

She was a skilled painter and seamstress, creating many beautiful arts and crafts for herself, friends, and family. She enjoyed coloring and word search puzzle books and she had a love for shopping, whether it be a flea market, garage sale, Wal-Mart, Dollar Tree, or Salvation Army (which she often referred to as "Lil Abdallas"). She also found enjoyment watching Reba, Everyone Loves Raymond, and Antiques Roadshow on television.

As a collector of various items, she enjoyed purchasing and displaying souvenir spoons from each state she visited. She also collected roosters and her collection was on display in her home for all to enjoy. She appreciated the

beauty of plants and flowers and when her boys, friends, or family gifted her with such, she always expressed her appreciativeness. Decorating for holidays was a favorite of hers and she enjoyed celebrating each of them. Fall, Easter, and Christmas decorations were placed inside and outside, wreaths on the door, table runners set out, and any arts and crafts she created for that particular holiday were on display. She had a special love for her grandchildren and great-grandchildren, often sharing new photos of them with her visitors and exhibiting their latest artwork in her room. She was a soft-spoken and classy lady who appreciated the beauty in life. She will be dearly missed.
