He was born in Kinder, LA to Lon Jacob Moody Jr. and Cecile Badeaux Moody on January 11, 1928, the third of their four children. He grew up in sawmill camps until the family settled near Eunice, LA. In his teens he moved to Rayne where his father established Moody Truck Line.

As a young man he attended Louisiana Tech in Ruston before enlisting in the U S Navy, serving as an aviation specialist. After being honorably discharged he returned to Rayne to marry his sweetheart Johanne Mauboules on June 5, 1948. They made their home in Rayne and spent their lives together working, traveling and raising their family.

His interests included traveling in their motor homes, hunting, fishing, flying and following his children, grandchildren and great grandchildren in their scholastic and sporting events.

He was preceded in death by his wife, his beloved grandson Scott Savoy, his parents, his sister Margaret M. Pellegrin (Terry Sr.) of Houma, LA, and one brother Patrick Moody of Rayne.

Survivors include his daughter Cynthia M. Savoy (Rodney) of Lafayette, his son Dr. Edward M. Moody II (Marita Stelly) of Rayne, his brother L. J. Moody III and wife Louetta Hains Moody of Rayne, grandchildren Neil Savoy, Dr. Ed Moody III (Crystal Lyons) of Rayne, Shelley Savoy Cestia (Dr. Wayne ‘Boo’ Cestia) of Lafayette, Bryan J. 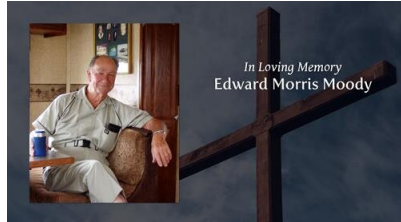
