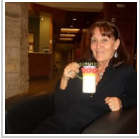

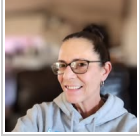

The thing that sticks in my head was she was always drawing. I remember, one day sitting in lecture next to her and she was drawing a picture of a woman's face. I seen it many times.

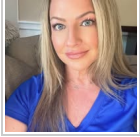
Sometimes it would be happy. Sometimes it would be sad.
