Purvis managed to grab hold on the cat line which slowed him enough to survive the fall. The Driller almost passed out just from watching Purvis fall!

He had such an awesome smile. Purvis had a pair of Dalmatians named Mary and Joseph. Great watch dogs! Purvis kept telling me not to enter his yard unless he opened the gate for me. I thought no way would Joseph bite me! He never barked at me. So one evening I decided I would enter the yard by myself. I walked to porch and as soon as I stepped on porch Joseph bit me on the leg! Thank goodness for thick Levi's! Purvis laughed so hard at me! I am so upset with myself for not keeping in touch with Purvis! I miss you my friend. If The Lord is willing, we will meet again!
